UKRAINE

The escalation of armed conflict in Ukraine on 24 February 2022 has resulted in a humanitarian crisis on a scale that Europe has not seen in decades. Thousands of civilians have died, even more have been injured and more than 14 million people have been internally displaced or have fled the country. Thousands more remain trapped in affected areas.

Ukrainian Red Cross and the ICRC have been on the frontlines, at the forefront of providing critical and lifesaving support to those affected, with thousands of volunteers working on the frontline assisting people in critical situations through their vast network across the country.

All components of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement – ICRC, IFRC, National Societies – have coordinated their efforts to support Ukrainian Red Cross to respond to the humanitarian needs. This support will continue in the months and years to come.

The Movement strives to provide assistance and protection to affected population, to defend their rights and dignity, and promote their social inclusion as well as their interaction in host communities.

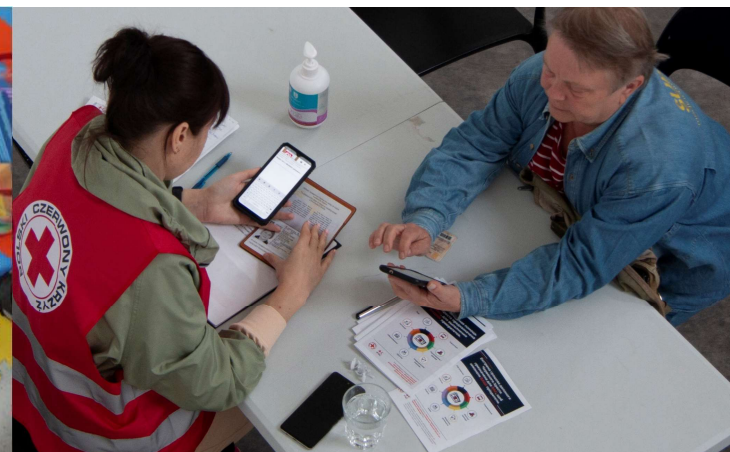
