IFRC's flagship initiative to support children's learning in safe, inclusive and resilient schools




### WHAT IS RED EDUCATION

Through its Global Red Cross and Red Crescent Education Network and its active engagement with various key stakeholders in the education sector, the IFRC collaboratively develops resources and tools to strengthen National Societies' capacity to address unmet, local education-related needs in cooperation and coordination with all relevant actors.

The RED Education toolbox includes:

# **Capacity-building resources:**

an effective support system for educators, a surge personnel training scheme, etc.



#### Standards and tools:

a comprehensive curriculum package, an education in emergencies toolkit, a child participation toolkit, etc.

# Policy, humanitarian diplomacy and partnerships' materials:

a guidance note for strengthening National Societies' education-related auxiliary role, a series of key messages and media assets for advocacy and resource mobilization, etc.



#### A COMPREHENSIVE CURRICULUM PACKAGE

The RED Education curriculum package represents the IFRC network's unique contribution to **global citizenship education** and **education for sustainable development.** 



- Over 70 lesson plans for foundational lifesaving and socioemotional learning such as basic and psychological first aid, risk awareness and safe behaviours in emergencies, empathy, critical thinking, communication and conflict resolution techniques
- Flexible modules that can be customized and taught over one or more school years, depending on the needs of the school or community
- Primarily designed for educators and volunteers working with secondary school age children and adolescents
- Suggested learning pathway variations to adapt to different age groups
- Suitable for both formal and non-formal education systems and settings
- Holistic, competence-based and action-oriented educational approaches
- Innovative methods and technologies for a meaningful, immersive learning experience

**RED** Education draws upon long established and well-tested quality educational initiatives and resources co-designed with young people.

#### SPECIFIC LEARNING OBJECTIVES OF THE CURRICULUM PACKAGE



Raise learners' understanding of all types of hazards and enable them to critically analyse risks in their school environment to then collaboratively develop and implement comprehensive school safety, climate adaptation and resilience plans.



Instil humanitarian spirit and values in learners, building up their agency and readiness to act in the face of challenges (including through nature-related techniques to manage ecoanxiety and strengthen personal resilience).



Strengthen learners' skills to prevent, prepare for, anticipate, respond to, cope with, adapt to and recover from adversity (including through psychological first aid, community-based action and advocacy).
